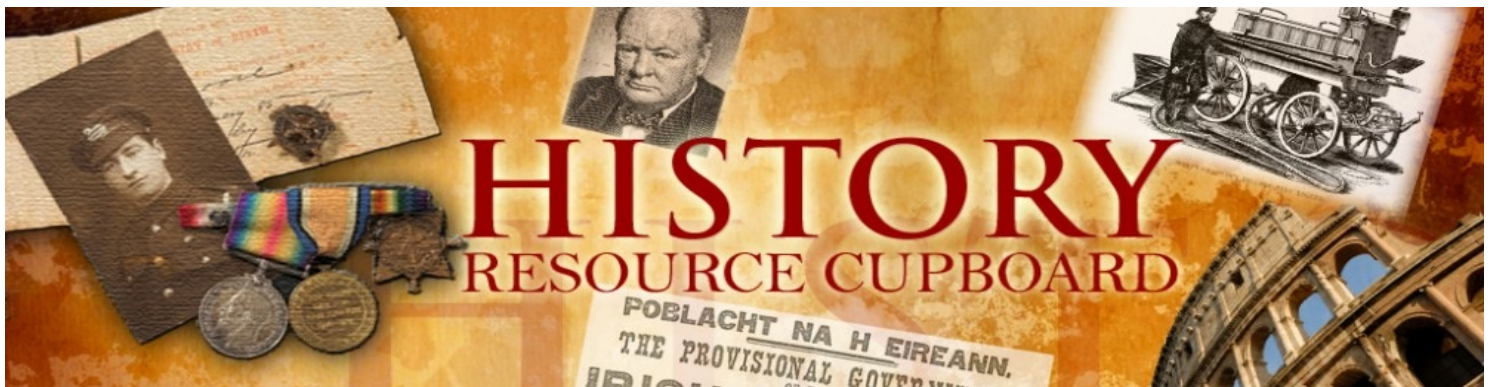


How to build a broad and coherent history curriculum
